# Supply List

To make 1 bigger leaf you'll need approximately 1 gram of wool.

## Materials:

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**wool - I use DHG 'Maori' batts (a blend of New Zealand wool) from Claire's Crafts Create with one exception:**

### **For the rusty blend**

- \* Rust
  - \* Cinnamon
  - \* Saffron
  - \* plus Rust from World of Wool
- Sienna from Claire's Crafts Create could be used instead of it

### **For the yellow blend**

- \* Sunflower - Unfortunately not sold anymore. But this light yellow blend could be made by mixing Light and Citron colours
- \* Saffron
- \* Rust

### **For the green blend**

- \* Asparagus
- \* Sage
- \* Ivy

## Materials cont.:

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### **embroidery floss:**

\* DMC 100% cotton embroidery floss - colour code: 435

## Tools:

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### **felting needles:**

\* 1 X 38 gauge star, triangle or crown needle

\* 1 X 40 gauge (twisted) triangle needle

\* punch tool with multiple needles (38 gauge)



### **embroidery or large eye needle**



### **flat mat, e.g. 100% wool ironing mat**



### **thick paper for stencil, e.g. 300 g/m2 watercolour paper or cardboard**



### **pins**



### **scissors**



### **leather finger protectors/guards**



### **lint remover - OPTIONAL**

# Needle Gauge Chart

Generally, we use 40 gauge needles to fine, 38 gauge to medium and 36 gauge (or smaller) to coarse wool. This chart helps you match the wool with the needle you need more easily.

Needle gauge	Wool fibre softness	Breeds
40 and 42	<b>FINE</b> under 27 microns	Merino Corriedale
38	<b>MEDIUM</b> under 33 microns	<b>Corriedale</b> <b>Shetland</b> <b>Perendale</b>
38 and 36	<b>MEDIUM-COARSE</b> under 38 microns	<b>Jacob</b> Gotland White Faced Woodland Norwegian
36 or lower number	<b>COARSE</b> over 38 microns	Herdwick

Naturally, there are more breeds you can choose from depending on where you live. I only mentioned the most typically used ones.

The breeds in bold are the ones I use frequently and I am very satisfied with.

**This chart, however, does not mean that you cannot opt for a different needle size ever!**
